Appendix 1. Senior Hurling League Format 2018

Background

With new inter-county championship formats introduced in both football (Super 8s) and hurling (provincial group stage) for 2018, the changing inter-county scene will have a significant impact on club programmes within Cork. While the intense inter-county programme for the first half of the year (with the exception of the 'April window' for club fixtures) may restrict significant progression of club championships beyond round 1, it also presents an ideal opportunity to present to players a definite league programme across the spring and summer months and to finish all league programmes earlier.

With this in mind, significant time has been spent in reviewing all aspects of the senior and intermediate leagues in Cork for 2018 and beyond. In line with the wishes of clubs to finish leagues earlier and play regularly throughout the summer, a complete programme of games with ratified times and dates is included. Cognisance is also taken of providing an equal number of weekends for football and hurling, as well as of the inter-county programme in terms of both league and championship and of course the club championship window in April / May. A league 'masterplan' is included in the table below. The following points are worth noting.

- 12 league weekends are listed for both football and hurling, respectively, across 6 months, from February to July. The final round of league fixtures is on Sunday, July 29th. No league group will have more than 12 regular rounds and most will have less, therefore finishing earlier than the above date.
- A further 4-week period, running to Sunday August 26th has been designated as a 'catch-up' period for unplayed games. This date is the final cut-off point for all league fixtures. If Cork senior teams exit in late June / early July, then the recommencement of club championships might affect the league dates set for July. Therefore, August also allows some room for 'catching up' in this regard also.
- Not all league groups have 12 rounds of fixtures, therefore some groups will start later / finish earlier than others.
- Where clubs are fixed to play games against second teams, they are asked to allow flexibility in the re-fixing of such games due to the obvious clash.
- The calendar is adapted to avoid direct clashes with Cork senior championship games. Thus, games in May, June and July alternate between Saturdays and Sundays based on current information. Later rounds may be switched depending on the progress of Cork teams.
- If clubs require additional fixtures, the board would consider the reintroduction of various tournaments such as the Tadhg Crowley Cup or the hurling equivalent in late summer for those who neared completion of their league programmes.
- With regard to the availability of county senior footballers, three dates have been listed on which all such players will be available for club league games: Sunday Feb

18th, Sunday March 11th and Sunday April 15th. An additional date may be added depending on progress in the National league. This has been agreed with the senior football management. In addition it has been proposed by the same management that they carry reduced panels to national league fixtures.

- With regard to the availability of county senior hurlers, two dates have been listed on which all such players will be available for club league games Sunday April 8th and Sunday, April 22nd. Given the condensed nature of the National hurling league there are no other dates available at present, pending Cork's progression to the later stages of the leagues. This has been agreed with the senior hurling management.

Finally, while the 'masterplan' gives the overall start and finish dates for leagues, the actual dates for first and last rounds dates for each division are as follows, notwithstanding the period running until August 26th for catching up on unplayed games.

Rebalancing the Hurling Leagues

The integrity of all league groups as they finished in 2017 has been maintained, with promotion and relegation completed as agreed at the start of 2017. This means, however, that some groups have more teams than others. With 18 teams in the senior hurling league it has now been agreed that all teams in this league will play 12 group games against a balanced sample taken from the 18 teams (Appendix 1) with their championship first round game representing a 13th fixture. Unlike other groups, the top 8 in the senior hurling league will proceed to a quarter final play-off stage, thus giving 8 teams a 14th game.

Meanwhile, the smallest group is the 9 teams in division 2 of the hurling leagues. This has been caused by the winners of the Premier Intermediate championship coming from this division in the last two years. It is planned to address such imbalances through promotion and relegation over the next three years.

At the end of each of the next three seasons (2018, 2019 and 2020), there will be two teams relegated from the Senior Hurling League with one team promoted from Division 1. There will be no link between promotion / relegation in league and championship. Therefore the teams in the senior hurling leagues will be reduced from 18 to 15 over the same period.

In an effort to balance the other league groups, relegation and promotion for the next three years is set out below.

Where one team is promoted from a division, it will be the winners of the league final who move up. Where one team is relegated a play-off between the bottom two will determine who goes down.

Ultimately, it is not possible to accurately predict the number of teams in Division 4 annually, as it will depend on championship promotion / relegation between Junior and Intermediate. The CCC reserves the right to balance the numbers between divisions accordingly.

Meanwhile, following adjustment a few years ago, the football groups are well balanced, however, ideally, a slight modification to form even numbered groups and therefore eliminate byes, will follow in the near future.

League Regulations 2018

(1) Completion Dates

The completion date for the group stage of the 2018 leagues is August 26th with the final round in each division scheduled during July. Dates and times for all rounds have been fixed by the CCC.

(2) Venues

The first named team has home venue, but if this venue is not available, the game will be played at the opponent's venue or at neutral venue.

(3) Referee

Where the appointed referee fails to attend, agreement must be reached between the two clubs on a substitute referee by either tossing or by agreement. Failure to comply will result in forfeiture of the league points by the club failing to agree. In the event of a referee being agreed by both clubs it is the responsibility of the club of the referee to ensure that the official report of the game is submitted within three days of the game. If the agreed referee is not a member of either participating club, the responsibility for ensuring the report is submitted shall rest with the home club.

(4) Fixtures

All fixtures are considered to be ratified for the dates and times listed. Any changes to this time and / or date must be notified to the office in Páirc Uí Chaoimh by both participating clubs through email only to administrator.cork@gaa.ie at least five days in advance of the fixture. When a postponement is sought, a definite date must be agreed by both clubs for the re-fixture and submitted with the request for the postponement. No postponements shall be granted within 3 days (72 hours) of scheduled games except in exceptional circumstances. Disputes in relation to fixture changes shall be referred to the CCC. League results shall be credited as follows: 2 points for a win, and one for a draw.

Unfulfilled Fixtures / Walkovers

A fine of €100 per team will apply for each unfulfilled fixture, unless a walkover is given by one of the teams. Walkovers will be awarded automatically where one of the teams involved fails to fulfil or indicates their intention not to fulfil a fixture without the submission of an agreed re-fixture date. A fine of €100 will apply to the relevant team in each case. Disputes in relation to the non-fulfilment of a fixture will be referred to the CCC.

If a club is disqualified or retires during the course of the league stage, its played games shall stand and its unplayed games shall be awarded to the opposing teams. A fine of €100 per game applies. Meanwhile, clubs who fail to complete their league programme will be asked to provide an explanation to the CCC.

Championship games

Where clubs in the same league are meeting in championship, league points may be awarded for the championship game, subject to the agreement of both clubs and subject to general rule with regard to suspensions. Such agreements should be notified to administrator.cork@gaa.ie at least one week prior to the relevant league or championship game, whichever is earlier. For 2018, such games are scheduled towards the end of the league and have been highlighted.

Substitutions

Up to nine (9) substitutions shall be permitted in the playing of normal time in all games in the County Leagues, County Junior Leagues 'A' and 'B' and other Secondary Competitions under the jurisdiction of Coiste Chontae Chorcaí. Rule 2.4, Rules of Specification, Official Guide, Part 2 sections (ii), (iii), (iv) and (v) shall not be affected by this deviation. A maximum of three substitutes remains for extra-time, where played.

Placings

Where teams finish with equal points for qualification for the concluding stages, or for promotion / relegation, the tie shall be decided by the following means and in the order specified (as per Official Guide).

- i. Where two teams only are involved – the outcome of the meeting of the two teams in the previous game in the competition
- ii. Scoring difference (subtracting the total scores against from total scores for)
- iii. Highest total score for
- iv. Exceptions: In relation to means (ii) and (iii) above, if the accumulated scores of a team, so involved, are affected by a disqualification, retirement or walkover, the tie shall be decided by a play off.

Promotion / Relegation

For the 2018 season, promotion and relegation between the divisions is as follows:

(5) Monitoring of leagues

The programme of league fixtures will be examined at one county board meeting each month. All outstanding fixtures will be adjudicated on at CCC meeting prior to this meeting. The CCC will monitor the progress of all teams in all Leagues on a regular basis.

(6) Challenge Games

Permission for challenge games may only be granted where a club is up-to-date with its league programme.

(7) Presentation of games

Pitches are to be properly lined and flagged.

The national flag is to be flown for all League games.

Teams are to be numbered properly.

Teams are requested to dress uniformly (matching socks and shorts)

(8) Match results by text

The home club is responsible for returning all match results. The person in this club appointed to return results will receive a text message prior to the commencement of the game.

(9) Correspondence

All correspondence in relation to leagues or secondary competitions is to be submitted by email only to administrator.cork@gaa.ie and copied to vicechairperson.cork@gaa.ie

Appendix 1. Senior Hurling League Format 2018

Considering the expressed desire of senior hurling clubs to have one league group for 2018 (18 teams) as well as the fact that playing 17 games (or indeed 16 if league points were awarded for first round championship games) would be unrealistic given the average number of league matches played by senior clubs in recent years, the following league format will be implemented for 2018.

12 regular league matches (not including championship games) can be provided for all 18 teams in the following fair and transparent manner, outlined below:

- (i) Rank all senior hurling teams (1-18) based on their league performances in the senior hurling league group stages across the last 3 seasons (2015, 2016 & 2017)
- (ii) Group the 18 teams into 3 even groups of 6 based on their rankings
- (iii) Adjust the groups slightly, to avoid a repeat of championship pairings (without any change in ranking level)
- (iv) Each club will play 12 regular league fixtures versus the 12 teams NOT in their group. Their first round championship opponents would be included in their own group of 6 and this would provide a 13th match.

Round 2 championship opponents (4 loser's rounds) would overlap with a league fixture. If this league game was not played in block 1 (before championship first round) league points could be given for the championship result subsequently if both clubs agreed.

Ultimately, the final league table will resemble a regular league table with all teams included, the only difference being the total number of 13 games played, with a maximum of 26 points achievable.

Given that Bandon and Newcestown had competed in only 1 and 2 years in the senior hurling league all of their numbers were multiplied by 3 and 1.5, respectively. Ultimately, this made no difference to their ranking. As Kanturk

are new to the league they were ranked 18th. An alternative version of this league table was also made, taking 5 years of leagues into account, but this made almost no difference to the rankings and was considered less relevant than a 3 year window given the annual turnover in panels. A version taking both league and championship into account was also considered, but again while it made no major difference to the rankings it was considered fairer to use league results only when compiling rankings for use in league competitions.
