# Club Facilities Development

Visitors to the pitch over the past few weeks will have noticed that work on the new dressing rooms has started following the recent appointment of Martin Roche Construction as main contractor.

The new building, which will house two dressing rooms as well as a multi-purpose club room, was designed by local architect Neil Kane of Kane Architects. Significant progress has already been made on site, with foundations complete and rising block-work well underway, and it is hoped to have work completed and the new facilities open before the end of the summer. This project is being funded by a combination of government Sports Capital funding and on-going club fund-raising activities. The club would like to thank everyone involved in securing Sports Capital funding and all those who are helping in the various club fund-raising activities for making the construction of this vital piece of club infrastructure possible. It is the latest in a series of measures undertaken to upgrade to facilities at the club in recent years, with previous works carried out including improved drainage of the playing field, new dugouts and the additional of a lighted public walkway and associated fencing around the perimeter of the main pitch.
